



Become a VIP - Volunteer in the Parks! The Chicago Park District (CPD) manages over 220 facilities throughout the city including 7600 acres of parkland and 59 nature areas. The Chicago Park District provides a variety of volunteer stewardship opportunities in the District's nature areas. Stewardship is a satisfying and rewarding way to not only experience the natural areas in the city, but also contribute in a meaningful way to the ecological health of these areas.

For this project, you'll work with a representative from Chicago Park District to find a local park facility or nature area where you and your project team can volunteer. The Chicago Park District currently has 24 nature area volunteer stewards that organize regular volunteer stewardship workdays at 21 nature areas. For a C3 project you may choose to work with an existing stewardship group or take on a new project at a stewardless nature area. To make this a C3 project, you'll need to volunteer for four workdays and involve a project team of at least two people. The Park District will help you organize a series of volunteer workdays or a volunteer project, which may consist of restoration projects such as: planting native species, removing invasive species, trash pickup, leading nature walks, or building bird and bat houses. The Chicago Park District is open to creative ways of engaging the community in their local nature area, so new ideas are always welcome.

Timeline:

Project Proposal due online: 1 week after the Community Organizing class

Part I: Contact the CPD representative and choose your site: 2 weeks

Part II: Begin site visits and tracking environmental benefits: 2 months

Part III: Final Report due online: 2 weeks after your last visit

Part IV: Follow up (optional): Continue cleanup at your site

Materials:

- Trash bags to collect waste
- Canvas work gloves
- Blue bags to collect recyclables
- Disposable gloves

Part I: Contact the CPD Representative and Choose Your Site

Part II: Tracking Environmental Benefits

~2 months

Once you begin your site visits, make sure you record and calculate your project's environmental benefits. This could include the amount of litter collected, number of site visits, number/weight/volume of invasive species removed, community members involved, and outreach you did around your site visits.

Part III: Turn in Final Report

Within 2 weeks of project completion

As soon as you've calculated environmental benefits, please fill out your **Final Report** online. Corresponding materials such as digital photographs, outreach flyers or posters, press releases, or news clippings should be emailed to conservation@cityofchicago.org.

Part IV: Continued Site Visits (Optional)

We hope you will continue volunteering long after you graduate from C3. We also hope that you will consider being trained as a full site Steward – think of the impact you could have.
